Mayor Dorough called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m., and advised that the invocation will be given by Pastor Solomon Loud, Jr., New Beginnings Missionary Baptist Church. The pledge of allegiance followed.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Commissioner Howard moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Gaines and, following a roll call vote, the motion unanimously carried.

[FIRST READING] Amending section 3(i) of the Charter of the City of Albany mandating appointments, adding the position Director, Municipal Court Administration; to provide for appointment of such position

Commissioner Young then offered the ordinance and asked for its adoption, seconded by Commissioner Howard and following a roll call vote, the motion carried 4-3 with Commissioners Johnson, Warbington and Langstaff voting no.

Commissioner Johnson introduced

AN ORDINANCE NO.

[SECOND READING] Amending Section 3(e) of the Charter of the City of Albany so as to increase the salaries of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners

Commissioner Johnson then offered the ordinance and asked for its adoption, seconded by Commissioner Howard and following a roll call vote, the motion carried 6-1 with Commissioner Langstaff voting no.

RESOLUTIONS

Discussion followed with Mayor Dorough suggesting that the properties be voted on separately with Mr. Davis agreeing.

Commissioner Howard moved to adopt the resolution accepting donated properties at 901 and 905 N. Jackson Street from Phoebe Putney's Memorial Hospital, seconded by Commissioner Johnson and following a roll call vote, the motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved to adopt the resolution authorizing the Land Bank to acquire 903 and 907 N. Jackson St., and following a roll call vote, the motion unanimously carried.

Discussion continued regarding notifying property owners, delinquent properties and the process that involves the Land Bank, with Mr. Forgey explaining.

Hearing no additional comments, and following a roll call vote, the motion carried 6-1 with Commissioner Young voting no.

MEMBER COMMENTS / ITEM FOR FUTURE AGENDA

Commissioner Warbington expressed disappointment regarding the lack of preparation with the State legislators, adding that the Commission showed up empty-handed. He suggested a legislative agenda on the at the next meeting to give forward the state legislators. In response to Commissioner Warbington, Mr. Davis agreed that a resolution would be more formal; Commissioner Warbington suggested having a special call meeting on Tuesday December 6.

Commissioner Young commented on the potential of mass evictions within the city and asked that this be looked at to allocate funds from ARPA and utilities assistance program.

Mayor Dorough agreed with comments from Commissioner Warbington on not being prepared today and suggested working with consultants and legislators regarding specific requests. He mentioned \$250 million allocated by the Governor and asked for an update to include the Civil Rights Institute, a proposal to renovate the Ritz Theatre, and Rails to Trail reallocation of funds.

The consensus was to have a special call meeting on Tuesday regarding legislative priorities at approximately 9:15 am.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm.
