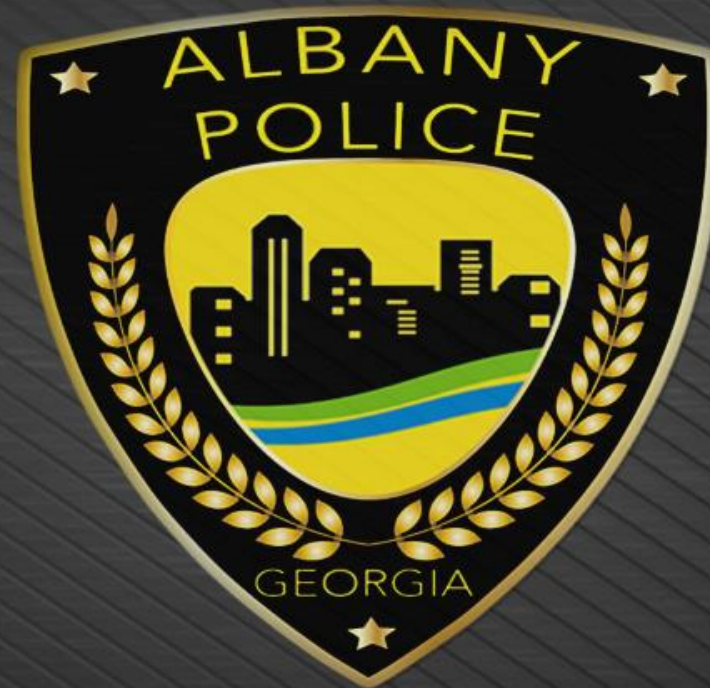


# Albany Police Department Quarterly Update

# Operational Update

- 20,509 Calls for service (Sept 1<sup>st</sup>-Nov 8<sup>th</sup>)
  - 14,716 Citizen Calls
  - 5,793 Officer Initiated Calls
- Incident Data
  - Part I Crimes – 821
  - Part II Crimes – 1337
  - 618 Individuals Booked into DOCO Jail, accounting for 580 incidents
- Traffic Accidents – 887
  - 0 Fatalities
  - 11 incidents DUI



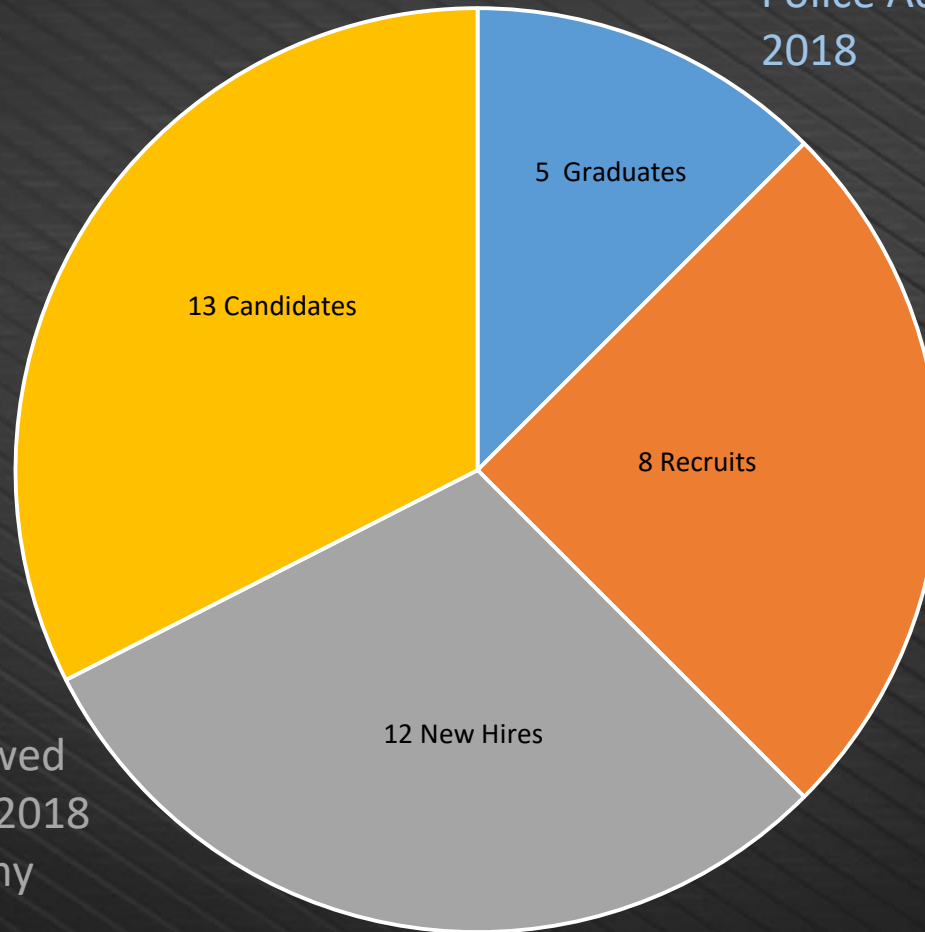


# Recruitment Status (38 total)
