

Re: Early Coordination Request for Proposed Albany Multimodal Transportation Center, City of Albany, Dougherty County, Georgia

The City of Albany, Georgia, with funding from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), proposes to construct a new Multimodal Transportation Center in the Albany downtown area, in Dougherty County. The proposed site is bounded on the north by West Oglethorpe Boulevard (US 82/US 19), on the east by South Jackson Street, and on the south by West Highland Avenue (see attached Project Location Map). The site is approximately 3.0 acres, and is currently occupied by commercial buildings, paved parking areas, a public alley, and vacant, vegetated space.

Albany Transit System (ATS) manages the city-wide public transportation services including fixed route and reserved paratransit services throughout the City of Albany. Currently, ATS operates daily service Monday through Saturday on ten established fixed routes as well as providing on-call reservation-based paratransit service. In its current configuration, ATS operates a hub and spoke system with the hub of the operation being at the Greyhound Bus Terminal on West Oglethorpe Boulevard. At present, ATS leases space within the Greyhound Bus Terminal building and shares the exterior operational and parking areas with Greyhound. The current building and loading/unloading the area serves as a central transfer facility within ATS's current system operations, providing services to more than 2,000 passengers on any given weekday. Since being relocated to the Greyhound Bus Terminal in the summer of 2001, the intent has been that the shared location on West Oglethorpe Boulevard would be a temporary arrangement until such time that ATS could develop its own permanent facility to meet their current and projected needs. The existing site layout and circulation patterns mix buses, automobiles and pedestrians, thereby compromising safety for passengers and pedestrians and hindering efficiency.

We respectfully request your assistance with identifying any known project area conditions of special concern within the study area. With your assistance, we can give these issues due consideration and integrate them into the development of the project design.

In addition, we would appreciate your assistance in identifying low income and minority neighborhoods (Environmental Justice Concerns) within the study area. This would also include help in identifying neighborhood leaders and minority groups or associations located throughout the affected communities. We would like to be certain that these communities are recognized fully throughout project development.



The Historic Preservation Division (HPD) has reviewed the reports entitled, *Archaeological Survey and Evaluation*, *Albany Multimodal Transportation Center, City of Albany, Dougherty County, Georgia* and *Historic Resources Survey of the Albany Multimodal Transportation Center, Dougherty County, Georgia*, both prepared by New South Associates and dated March 6, 2017 and February 22, 2017, respectively. Our comments are offered to assist the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in complying with the provisions of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

The subject project consists of the construction of a new bus depot with associated facilities on a three (3) acre tract at South Jackson Street and Highland Avenue in Albany. Based on the information contained in the archaeological survey, HPD concurs that archaeological site 9DU286 is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) and within the proposed project's area of potential effect (APE). Additionally, HPD concurs with avoidance of the site, along with archaeological monitoring during all demolition and pave surface removal activities.

Based on the information contained in the historic resources survey, HPD concurs that the proposed project is within the NRHP-eligible Albany Freedom historic district. Additionally, HPD concurs that GNAHRGIS resources 205053, 205054, 205055, 205056, 215609 (which appears to refer to 205610/320 Highland Avenue), and 215613 are contributing to the NRHP-eligible Albany Freedom historic district. Furthermore, HPD concurs that resources 1/205057, 2, 3, and 5/205059 are not contributing to the NRHP-eligible district.

However, HPD is unable to concur with the eligibility determination for resource 4/215609. It appears to HPD that the majority of the alterations occurred during the historic period of the NRHP-eligible Albany Freedom historic district, are indicative of the material changes along with the population growth of Albany, and the plight of the African American laborer. Therefore, it is HPD's opinion that resource 4/215609 is contributing to the NRHP-eligible Albany Freedom historic district. Furthermore, there appear to be additional resources in GNAHRGIS within the proposed project's area of potential effects (APE). HPD recommends assessing the contributing status of these resources, as well as individual NRHP-eligibility.
